




OTTAWA'S ABORIGINAL POPULATION

Key characteristics

According to the 2011 National Household Survey, there were **19,200 Aboriginals** living in Ottawa in 2011 (2% of the total population); 80% were aged 15 or older. With a labour force of 11,115 people, the participation rate sat at 73% (compared to 70% for Ottawa's total population). The employment and unemployment rates were 65% and 10%, respectively.

A focus on the labour force

- 9,975 Aboriginals employed in Ottawa in 2011 (2% of total number of people employed in the city)
- **90%** of Aboriginals in the labour force were employed, while 10% were unemployed in 2011
- 80% of the Aboriginal population that worked in 2010 worked full-time; 20% worked part-time

Unemployment and career services


1,140 unemployed Aboriginals in Ottawa in 2011

Highest level of education, Aboriginals aged 15 and over, Ottawa, 2011



Industry breakdown







- Public administration has the greatest number of Aboriginal workers out of 20 industry sectors, with 3,075; Mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction has the highest proportion of Aboriginal workers, with 6%
- **O** Aboriginals working in the **Management of companies and enterprises** sector
- ◆ Aboriginal workers are distributed fairly proportionally across sectors; 11 sectors have an Aboriginal workforce that makes up 2% of the total workforce – the Aboriginal population in Ottawa as a percentage of the total population is also 2%

- Sales and service occupations have the greatest number of Aboriginal workers out of 10 occupation groups, with 2,605; this occupation group is tied with two others for having the highest proportion of Aboriginal workers, with 3%
- Occupations in manufacturing and utilities have the fewest Aboriginals, with just 80; this occupation group also has the lowest proportion of Aboriginal workers (1%)
- ◆ Aboriginal workers are distributed proportionally across occupation categories, with Aboriginals making up 1% to 3% of all workers in every category
